Progress on roof repairs

All internal work to the roof trusses, woodwork, plasterwork and painting is now complete.

The tilers have almost finished re-roofing the north face of the nave. When this is complete the scaffolding will come down (in two stages as there are repairs to be done to the cross over the sanctus bell). Then new scaffolding will be put in place to re-roof the porch.

Future Projects Requiring Fund Raising
